

Besides, the college has three distance education study centers of Gauhati University (IDOL), Krishna Kanta Handique Open State University (KKHSOU) offering graduate, post graduate degrees along with diplomas and certificate courses and Assam State Open School (ASOS) offering higher secondary level course in Arts stream.





Foreword

Raha College provides the ideal ambience for students having a desire to pursue higher education in Threeyear Degree course in the streams of Arts, Science and Commerce. The College Science introduced and Commerce stream from the academic session 2016-17. Set amidst the meadows and green foliage resplendent trees, in a serene atmosphere within the town, the College offers an ideal location for teaching-learning ambits. It is located at a distance of one and half K.M. from Raha town Natur Chariali and can approached from three main roads. It is only at a distance of 400 meter from the of NH-37 junction road toward Chaparmukh Railway junction. This seat of higher learning celebrated its Golden Jubilee in 2015 and was reaccredited "B" grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The College has distance education centers at present functioning under Gauhati University and Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University, BA and offering MA programmes, and Assam State Open School (ASOS) offering Higher Secondary level course in Arts stream.



The dream of setting up a seat of higher learning was achieved through the endeavor, zeal and aspiration of some far-sighted and enlightened social activists of greater Raha area, and it turned into a reality with the establishment of the College on 28th July 1964. Till date, Raha College is the only general degree college Raha Legislative Assembly Constituency reserved for Scheduled Caste. The College is permanently affiliated to Gauhati University. Apart from the regular degree course, the College also runs the HS course in Arts, Science and Commerce streams as per AHSEC curriculum. The College has rich faculty members, a modern library and a Computer Centre. It is worth mentioning that the teaching-learning process has received a fillip with the introduction of state of art digital class rooms constructed with the financial assistance received from the Govt, of Assam, Under RUSA grant, new infrastructures like the new academic building, renovated acoustic auditorium, cycle stand, Science laboratory, renovated classrooms, etc. have been set up.

Infrastructure Development

The college is endowed with excellent physical infrastructural facilities to support the teaching -learning process. The main campus is spread over 6.48 acres. The college has a spacious seminar/conference hall. There are adequate numbers of classrooms, separate departments, and separate departmental class rooms to facilitate the academic programmes. The infrastructure involves spacious class rooms, proper

lighting and ventilation, seating arrangement with proper visibility for both students and teachers. There are common rooms for boys and girls separately. There is a special arrangement for canteen for students and staff, and there is an auditorium cum indoor stadium. The college has hostel facility for boys and a girl's hostel is constructed. The details of the facilities available with the institution are as under.

Technology Enabled Learning Facility:

The College has an ICT Classroom where the provision of OHPs (Overhead Projectors), Multimedia Learning, Wi-Fi Connectivity is available. A new computer lab with 25 computers has been set up. The Computer Education Center is situated near the Central Library at present. The institute has set up a 25KVA eco-friendly silent generator for power backup to the campus during electric failure.

Conference Hall:

The College has one modern conference hall and it is regularly used for conducting Seminars, Conferences, etc



Hostel Facility:

The College has one Boy's Hostel within the college Campus. The number of seats available at present is 18. Hostel seats are allotted at the time of admission on the basis of merit. The girls hostel is nearing completion.



Laboratories:

The College has two well equipped laboratories in the Arts stream, one in Education department and the other in Geography department for conduct of practical classes during the session and in annual examination. New modern Science laboratories have been set up. The college received funds from RUSA for construction of science laboratories

Canteen Facility:

The College has a canteen in the campus. Students can have refreshment in the canteen during the college hour

Library Facility

Raha College Central library has more than 26,000 books which include text books. reference books, magazines journals: etc. The library remains open on all working days from 9.00 AM to 4.00 PM. Photostat facility is available at a nominal rate students of the college. A student is provided with a card with the facility to borrow two books at a time for 15 days. A major or honors student gets the privilege for borrowing 4 books at a time. Students are to follow library rules. State of the art Digital Library is another important feature of the library

Auditorium cum Indoor Stadium A Spacious 2 acre play ground is available for outdoor games i. e., cricket, football, athletics etc. in the college campus. There are separate volleyball and badminton courts in the campus. A practicing ground with nets for cricketers have been set up separately.

Facilities for sports like Table Tennis, Chess, multi-gym, Carom, etc, are available to students. Gym facilities for both students and staff is available in tune with the Fit India initiative.

The College has a modern and state of art acoustic auditorium. The seating capacity of the auditorium is around 600.



Class Rooms: All the departments have their individual classrooms for taking major/honors classes. Besides, there are sufficient classrooms, some of them renovated recently through RUSA funds to facilitate students in their learning.

Choice Based Credit System at Undergraduate level:

As per UGC recommendation Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) has been implemented in all colleges under Gauhati University from the academic session 2019-20 and Raha College is no exception CBCS offers the student a diversity of courses to choose from and the autonomy to decide on the place, pace and time of learning.

The UG degree programme in CBCS has courses spread across six-semesters. A typical semester comprises a minimum of 15 to18 weeks of academic work that will translate into 90 actual teaching days. Two consecutive semesters-one Odd (June to November) and one Even (December to May) will make up an academic year.

Each student must take admission in three consecutive Academic Sessions starting with the first semester. Students who do not enroll in the Second Academic Session will not be eligible to take admission in the Third Academic Session. The minimum time requirement to acquire an undergraduate degree will be three years and the maximum time will be six years.

Propose of Equation

In the line with UGC's guideline the courses are categorized as Core courses, Elective courses or Ability Enhancement courses. Core courses are to be compulsorily studied. An Elective course is to be chosen by the student from a pool of courses on offer and will essentially be of three types: Discipline Specific Elective Course, Generic Elective Course and Dissertation or Project. Ability enhancement Courses will also be of two types: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses.

Evaluation:

A student's performance will be evaluated throughout the year based on continuous assessment. Evaluation of the student's performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination. To pass in a course/paper a student will have to pass in Internal Assessment and

End Semester Examination separately.

Admission **Procedure**

The Applicants have to filled application form online through college Website within the stipulated period to be motified in the college website, i.e-www.rahacollege.co.in.

After scrutiny of the application forms, a provisional merit list will be notified in the college website and selected candidates will have to take admission within the stipulated period to be motified in the college website.

- 1. Admission is made strictly on the basis of merit and is governed by College Admission Rules. The decision of the Admission Committee regarding admission is final.
- 2. Any pressure or interference from any quarter for the admission of a particular student will result in forfeiture of the claim.
- Candidates are required to produce at the time of veryfication the original copies of
 - (a) Mark sheet of the qualifying examination
 - (b) Age Certificate
 - (c) Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended and
 - (d) Caste certificate

Students passing the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a gap certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.

- 4. There is a provision for reservation of seats as per Govt. of Assam rules and in this respect caste certificate issued by competent authority under Govt. of Assam shall be valid.
- 5. There is a provision for reservation of seats for students having competence in extracurricular. activities,

Attendance Rules

Students who do not attend 75% of the total number of classes held in one academic session/one semester will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.

Students who fail to attend their classes for a certain period of time on genuine and acceptable grounds must apply in writing to the Head of the Department concerned for consideration of exemption of the absence for the period, immediately after absence.

- As per UGC Guideline no F 1-16/2007 (CPP-11) April 2009, all forms of Ragging in Hostels and outside and inside the college campus are prohibited. Ragging is considered as an offence under the law of the land and ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire institution.
- The courses of studies in the College are full time courses. No student can take any other full time course simultaneously.


College Identity Card must be renewed for each academic session.
