Foreword

Raha College provides the ideal ambience for students having a desire to pursue higher education in Three-year Degree course in the streams of Arts, Science and Commerce. The College introduced Science and Commerce stream from the academic session 2016-17. Set amidst the meadows and lush green foliage of resplendent trees, in a serene atmosphere within the town, the College offers an ideal location for teaching-learning ambits. It is located at a distance of one and half K.M. from Raha town Natun Chariali and can be approached from three main roads. It is only at a distance of 400 meter from the junction of NH-37 road toward Chaparmukh Railway junction. This seat of higher learning celebrated its Golden Jubilee in 2015 and was reaccredited "B" grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The College has three distance education centers at present functioning under Gauhati University and Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University, offering BA and MA programmes, and Assam State Open School (ASOS) offering Higher Secondary level course in Arts stream.

The dream of setting up a seat of higher learning was achieved through the endeavor, zeal and aspiration of some far-sighted and enlightened social activists of greater Raha area, and it turned into a reality with the establishment of the College on 28th July 1964. Till date, Raha College is the only general degree college in Raha Legislative Assembly Constituency reserved for Scheduled Caste. The College is permanently affiliated to Gauhati University. Apart from the regular degree course, the College also runs the HS course in Arts as per AHSEC curriculum. The College has rich faculty members, a modern library and a Computer Centre. It is worth mentioning that the teaching-learning process has received a fillip with the introduction of state of art digital class rooms constructed with the financial assistance received from the Govt. of Assam. Under RUSA grant, new infrastructure like the new academic building, renovated acoustic auditorium, cycle stand, Science laboratory, renovated classrooms, etc, have been set up.

Goals and Objectives of the College

Raha College started its mission with zeal to promote higher education to the largely underdeveloped people of Raha locality since its inception in 1964. The mission of the College is to serve the rural youths by providing them with easy access to higher education and job opportunities. The College will strive towards integrated personality, growth of rural students in particular and students at large in which special attention is given to their intellectual, moral and cultural development. Another important objective of the College is to inculcate the spirit of inquisitiveness among the students and to instill in them the spirit of patriotism, dedication and humanistic values.

Vision

The vision of the College is to make it a seat of excellence and to uplift the living standards of the rural youths by imparting them higher education and fostering an enduring sense of discipline and single-minded dedication to their work.

INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

The college is endowed with excellent physical infrastructural facilities to support the teaching –learning process. The main campus is spread over 6.48 acres. The college has a spacious seminar/conference hall. There are adequate numbers of classrooms, separate departments, and separate departmental class rooms to facilitate the academic programmes. The infrastructure involves spacious class rooms, proper lighting and ventilation, seating arrangement with proper visibility for both students and teachers. There are common rooms for boys and girls separately. There is a special arrangement for canteen for students and staff, and there is an auditorium cum indoor stadium. The college has hostel facility for boys and a girl's hostel is being constructed. The details of the facilities available with the institution are as under.

1. **Technology Enabled Learning Facility:** The College has three ICT Classrooms where the provision of OHPs (Overhead Projectors), Multimedia Learning, Wi-Fi Connectivity is available. A new computer lab with 25 computers has been set up. The institute has set up a 25KVA eco-friendly silent generator for power backup to the campus during electric failure.
2. **Conference Hall:** The College has one modern conference hall and it is regularly used for conducting meetings, group discussions, etc.
3. **Laboratories:** The College has two laboratories in the Arts stream, one in Education department and the other in Geography department for conduct of practical classes during the session and in annual examination. New modern Science laboratories in all the science subjects available in our college have been set up. The college received funds from RUSA for construction of science laboratories.
4. **Library Facility:** Raha College Central library has more than 26,000 books which include text books, reference books, journals; magazines etc. The library remains open on all working days from 9.00 AM to 4.00 PM. Photostat facility is available at a nominal rate for students of the college. A student is provided with a card with the facility to borrow two books at a time for 15 days. A major or honors student gets the privilege for borrowing 4 books at a time. Students are to follow library rules. State of the art Digital Library is another important feature of the library
5. **Hostel Facility:** The College has one Boy's Hostel within the college Campus. The number of seats available at present is 18. Hostel seats are allotted at the time of admission on the basis of merit. The girls hostel is nearing completion.
6. **Canteen Facility:** The College has a canteen in the campus. Students can have refreshment in the canteen during the college hour.
7. **Sports Facility:** The College has always created a niche for itself in the field of sports. In sports, the college provides indoor and outdoor games.
8. **Outdoor Games:** A Spacious 2 acre play ground is available for outdoor games i.e., cricket, football, athletics etc. in the college campus. There are separate volleyball and

badminton courts in the campus. A practicing ground with nets for cricketers have been set up separately.

9. **Indoor Games:** Facilities for sports like Table Tennis, Chess, multi-gym, Carom, etc, are available to students. Gym facilities for both students and staff is available in tune with the Fit India initiative.
10. **Auditorium cum Indoor Stadium:** The College has a modern and state of art acoustic auditorium. The seating capacity of the auditorium is around 600.
11. **Class Rooms:** All the departments have their individual classrooms for taking major/honors classes. Besides, there are sufficient classrooms, some of them renovated recently through RUSA funds to facilitate students in their learning.
12. **Departmental Rooms:** The departments have been provided with individual rooms so that teachers can plan their classes and other related educational and co-curricular activities.
13. **Disabled friendly, barrier free environment:** There is ramp provision with built environment and one disabled –friendly washroom in the campus.
14. **Green campus initiatives of the college includes the following:** Pedestrian friendly pathways, landscaping with trees and plants, ban on use of plastic, no tobacco zone, restricted entry of automobiles in the college campus. Raha College received “ Green and Clean Award 2020” from Anti-Global Warming Society. Morigaon in 2021.

Courses of Study

Regular Courses:

1. Two-year Higher Secondary (HS) Course in Arts:

Admission is given purely on merit and is subject to Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC) Regulations.

Seats: 200

Combination of Subjects:

- i. English and Environmental Education are compulsory subjects.
- ii. A Student shall select any one of the Modern Indian Language from Assamese and Hindi. It is notified that AHSEC has decided to withdraw Alternative English from the MIL group from the next academic session 2021-22. Students for the session 2021-22 onwards have to take any of the MIL subjects as a core subject along with the English subject.
- iii. A student shall select three/four elective subjects from the following list.
With a maximum limit of 100 (one hundred) seats per subject
 - a) Economics b) Education c) Political Science d) History e) Geography f) Logic & Philosophy g) Anthropology h) Sociology and i) Advance Assamese/ Advance Hindi/Sanskrit j) Swadesh Adhayan*

*Students offering Swadesh Adhayan in Higher Secondary level are eligible to pursue Honours course at UG level in Geography or History.

Choice Based Credit System at Undergraduate level:

As per UGC recommendation Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is going to be implemented in all colleges under Gauhati University from the academic session 2019-20. CBCS offers the student a diversity of courses to choose from and the autonomy to decide on the place, pace and time of learning.

The UG degree programme in CBCS will have courses spread across six-semester. A typical semester will comprise a minimum of 15 to 18 weeks of academic work that will translate into 90 actual teaching days. Two consecutive semesters-one Odd (June to November) and one Even (December to May) will make up an academic year.

Each student must take admission in three consecutive Academic Sessions starting with the first semester. Students who do not enroll in the Second Academic Session will not be eligible to take admission in the Third Academic Session. The minimum time requirement to acquire an undergraduate degree will be three years and the maximum time will be six years.

Nature of Courses:

In line with UGC's guideline the courses are categorized as Core courses, Elective courses or Ability Enhancement courses. Core courses are to be compulsorily studied. An Elective course is to be chosen by the student from a pool of courses on offer and will essentially be of three types: Discipline Specific Elective Course, Generic Elective Course and Dissertation or Project. Ability enhancement Courses will also be of two types: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses.

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Evaluation:

A student's performance will be evaluated throughout the year based on continuous assessment. Evaluation of the student's performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination. To pass in a course/paper a student will have to pass in Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination separately.

Raha College has started a centre of Assam State Open School from the academic session 2018-19. This centre imparts Higher Secondary Level SOS course in Arts stream. The Gauhati University vide its notification no. GU/AC/Equ.com/2011/844-848 dated 22.07.2011 has accorded equivalent status to the students who pass from Assam State Open School with the students who pass +2 stage from AHSEC or any other Board recognized by the University.

In ASOS, HS level examination is conducted twice in a year. A learner can avail 9 chances of appearing in examination over a period of 5 years to complete the course.

Fee Structure

1. Admission Fee- Rs.200/-
2. Tuition Fees- Rs. 500/- (Per Month)

Admission Procedure

1. Application for admission into the H.S (Arts) 1st year and B.A, B.Com and B.Sc. 1st semester should be made in prescribed application form issued by the college office on payment of Rs. 220/- . Self attested copies of all related documents of the qualifying examination must be enclosed with the application form.
2. Admission is made strictly on the basis of merit and is governed by College Admission Rules. The decision of the Admission Committee regarding admission is final.
3. Any pressure or interference from any quarter for the admission of a particular student will result in forfeiture of the claim.
4. Candidates are required to produce at the time of admission the original copies of
 - (a) Mark sheet of the qualifying examination
 - (b) Age Certificate
 - (c) Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended and
 - (d) Caste certificateStudents passing the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a gap certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
5. There is a provision for reservation of seats as per Govt. of Assam rules and in this respect caste certificate issued by competent authority under Govt. of Assam shall be valid.
6. There is a provision for reservation of seats for students having competence in extracurricular activities.

Attendance Rules

- Students who do not attend 75% of the total number of classes held in one academic session/one semester will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.
- Students who fail to attend their classes for a certain period of time on genuine and acceptable grounds must apply in writing to the Head of the Department concerned for consideration of exemption of the absence for the period, immediately after absence.

Maintenance of Discipline

- Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building of students and they are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline.
- The students admitted to the college must abide by rules and regulations as prescribed by college authority. Violation of rules, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of College and Hostel fees, showing disregard to the teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination etc. are some of offences which may make students liable for disciplinary action.
- Student's Union and all other Associations working in the College shall be subject to such guidance & control as the College administration may prescribe from time to time.
- Any notice desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the College Premises shall require the approval of the Principal. The permission from the College Authority is required in order to conduct any activity in the campus.

- As per UGC Guideline no F 1-16/2007 (CPP-11) April 2009, all forms of Ragging in Hostels and outside and inside the college campus are prohibited. Ragging is considered as an offence under the law of the land and ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire institution.
- The courses of studies in the College are full time courses. No student can take any other full time course simultaneously.

Note to Parents

Parents and guardians are reminded that they should follow the student's progress in studies and his/her general conduct in and outside the college. The college expects parents or guardians to co-operate with the college authorities in the education of their children. Their co-operation is solicited especially to ensure a regular attendance. They are asked to take special note of warning issued to students in the previous page.

College Uniform

Code of Conduct for Students
