Teachers are encouraged to use ICT as their teaching aids to make their classes more interesting and effective. For this, the college provides necessary infrastructure, namely, PC, laptop, LCD projectors, white board, etc to the departments

Most of the teachers prepare the study materials and distribute the same to the students.

The college conducts the end semester examinations as per schedule of the affiliating university.

The college administration takes all the necessary steps for fair examinations.

The college teachers are released from their duties by the authority to evaluate the answer scripts as required.
